Local Assistance Center

A Local Assistance Center (LAC) will open on Nov. 14, 2024, at the Ventura County Office of Education (VCOE) Conference Center (located at 5100 Adolfo Road in Camarillo) to assist residents with the Mountain Fire recovery process.

The recovery process involves multiple partners from different government agencies, and the LAC is designed to provide one centralized location for information, referrals, resources and services to individuals and families impacted by the fire.

There will be a number of County, City and State agencies, as well as nonprofit organizations, offering support, services and information related to rebuilding, tax relief, business and employment assistance, debris removal, permits, housing, rental assistance, vital records, property assessments, public assistance, crisis intervention stress management and basic needs. Services such as replacement of driver's licenses and connection to healthcare resources will also be available.

The LAC will be open Monday through Saturday from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. The hours and days are subject to change depending on demand. Bilingual staff will be available to provide assistance.
